# PENCILS ARE BACK!

... and they're better and thicker than ever before

In the '90s, when dark, matte lips were in fashion, chubby pencils and crayons reigned supreme. The lipliner-and-colour-in-one that could be applied without fuss was a staple in many make-up bags.

Fast forward some 20 years and they're back – and the thicker, the better! The formulations are now also more advanced. Not only is the texture softer, they won't dry out your lips either.

'Pencils are back in a big way,' renowned make-up artist Bobbi Brown says. 'They're quick, mistake-proof and can go from subtle to bold in one easy stroke.'

Bobbi's own make-up line has just released lip crayons in six shades, and many other brands, such as Poppy King's Lipstick Queen, have crayons permanently on their range.

'They're kooky and fun,' says Poppy, whose lip crayons have a glossy finish.

But it's not just lip pencils that are making a comeback.

Thick eyeshadow and eyeliner pencils are also popular additions to ranges from brands such as Revlon and Almay.

Depending on the colour, these powdery pencils can be used to shade the entire eyelid or to create a thick line just along the lash line – perfect for glamping up before a night out.

The trick when using an eyeshadow pencil is to make sure the product is blended so you don't end up with scribbles back and forth on your eyelids. The colour in these pencils is buildable so you can get as sheer or as opaque a coverage as you want.

Pencils with chiselled tips, such as the ones from Styli-Style, are also able to create thinner lines by using the smaller edge. **NI**

How can I find a foundation that matches my skin tone?

If you're buying a foundation for the first time, visit a store where a tester is provided. Don't test it on your hand. Instead, apply it to your jawline to find your match – it's best to test it close to where you'll actually wear it. Your jaw is also the place where you'll blend the foundation down onto your neck, so check that the blend line is invisible.
